I refer to the above details. An appeal has been made to the Secretary of State against the decision of Ipswich Borough Council to refuse planning permission.

Ipswich Borough Council has refused the above planning application on the grounds that:

Paragraph 135 of Section 12 (Achieving well-designed places) of the National Planning Policy Framework 2024 states that (a) planning policies and decisions should ensure that developments will function well and add to the overall quality of the area, not just for the short term but over the lifetime of the development; (d) establish or maintain a strong sense of place, using the arrangement of streets, spaces, building types and materials to create attractive, welcoming and distinctive places to live, work and visit; and (f) create places that are safe, inclusive and accessible and which promote health and well-being, with a high standard of amenity for existing and future users. Policy DM12 (Design and Character) of the Core Strategy and Policies DPD Review (2022) states the Council will require all new development to be well-designed and sustainable. DM12(h) further seeks to ensure good public realm design that enhances the streetscape and protects and reinforces a sense of place, through the appropriate use of public art, bespoke paving, street furniture and soft landscaping. Policy DM13(h) requires development within conservation areas to protect and enhance the special interest, character and appearance of the area and its setting, while DM13(i) seeks to require the position, mass, layout, appearance and materials of proposed development to pay regard to the character of adjoining buildings and the area as a whole. Policy DM34 states that proposals for the expansion of electronic communications networks will be supported, where they preserve the historic environment and do not harm the appearance of the street scene.

It is considered that the highly trafficked nature of the location and the surrounding conservation area context render the additional hub structure more likely to harm than protect or enhance the streetscape, therefore inconsistent with policy DM12. The Street Hub and the existing JCDecaux advertising hoarding would be situated barely 7m apart and nearly parallel; thereby it is considered that this will result in significant visual cluttering and adverse impacts to the conservation area setting, which is also located in a position in close proximity to historic buildings, inconsistent with aims and objectives of policies DM13 and DM34. As a consequence, the proposal is considered to be contrary to policies DM12, DM13 and DM34 of the Core Strategy and Policies DPD Review (2022), and the National Planning Policy Framework 2024.

The applicants have lodged an appeal with the Secretary of State against the Council's decision. The appeal is to be decided on the basis of the exchange of written statements together with a site visit by a Planning Inspector.
